I understand that participation in the game of Paintball, the Challenge Ropes Course, and Archery requires good physical condition and can result in accidental injury or death if played incorrectly.

Paintball: I agree to talk to my child and inform him / her to wear a protective mask while in the designated field at all times, and to abide by the rules and safety guidelines set forth by the Lost Creek Village staff.

Challenge Ropes Course: I agree to talk to my child and inform him/ her to wear long shorts/ pants and modest shirts to avoid rope burns and to wear a helmet at all times in the designated areas and follow all rules and safety guidelines set forth by the Lost Creek Village staff.

Archery: I agree to talk with my child and inform him / her to avoid wearing overly baggy clothing, to pull hair up and away from face and to not wear earrings, bracelets, or necklaces while performing archery. Each child is expected to follow the direction and rules of the Lost Creek staff and a child who is not abiding by these rules or exhibiting non-cooperative behavior will be removed from archery.

I understand that my child has the right to not participate if he/ she does not feel physically or emotionally safe. I understand that my child may be dismissed from participation for unsafe behavior or refusing to follow rules or guidelines set forth by the Lost Creek Village staff.

- Paintball, ropes, and archery may be paid separately or added to the final bill.

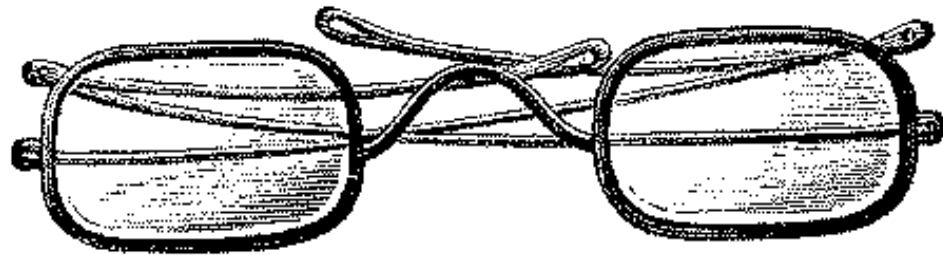

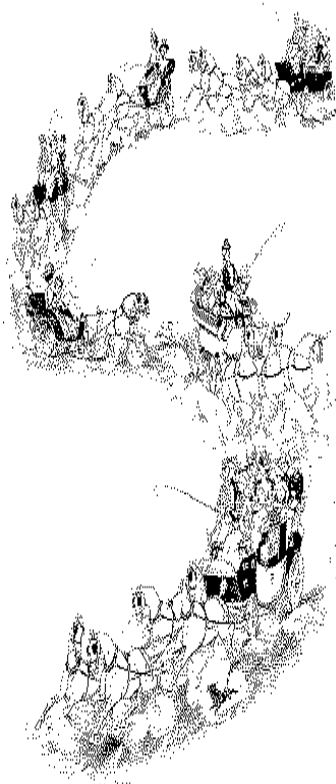

- To officially reserve your date: Have you sent in your signed contract? (Enclosed with this packet)
- Did you enclose your deposit or do you have one on file? Please call us if you are unsure if you have one on file.
- Do you have signed Lost Creek Village parent permission slips for all minors participating in paintball and the ropes course? (This includes all counselors and staff under 18 years of age.) The permission slip is included in this booklet.
- One month prior to your reservation: Have you provided us with your group's Certificate of Insurance Coverage? Please call us if you do not know if this applies to your group.
- One week before your reservation date: Have you given us a final head count for the camp cooks if you are having camp cooking provided by Lost Creek?
- One week prior to your reservation: Have you reserved your paintball and ropes times?
- Do you have your certified lifeguard lined up for the swimming pool?
- Have you given this booklet's policy information to all those who need it?
- Have you given us your t-shirt order if ordering?
- Do you have the appropriate number of adult leaders in place? See "Youth" section of this booklet for Health Department requirements.
- Youth groups: do you have an EMT, Nurse, or first aid trained person accompanying your group?
- Does at least one of your kitchen crew have a current Food Handler's Permit if you are cooking for yourselves?

We are here to help you with any questions and information you may need. It is our hope that you have a meaningful and encouraging time here at Lost Creek.



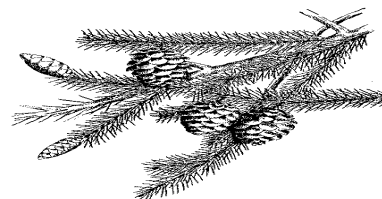

Lost Creek Policies and Guidelines

Please refer to the information in this booklet when planning your stay with us. All groups are expected to follow the policies in this booklet. Please be sure your staff and attendees are informed prior to arrival.

- A \$300 deposit is required to reserve your group's date and can be applied to your final bill or rolled-over to reserve for the following year. A separate deposit is required for each date if your group reserves multiple dates in a calendar year. Deposits are non-refundable within 3 months of your reserved date. We do not take reservations further than one-year in advance.
- Lost Creek Village reserves the right to change the terms of our policies and rates and will notify any group in a timely manner of any changes. Your group has the right to a refund of your deposit if these changes affect your ability to keep your reservation.
- No pets of any kind are allowed on the grounds. Please be sure to include this in your information to your group and guest speakers.
- Quiet time is observed at 10:00 p.m. We have neighbors and are considerate to their needs. Please adjust your sound system volume down if your sessions are going later than 10:00 p.m.
- No smoking permitted in buildings. Smoking is only permitted in outdoor graveled areas.
- The fire circle and BBQ grill may be used when not restricted by the Forest Service.

- No alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, firearms or explosive materials (including fireworks) are allowed on the grounds.
- Lost Creek Village provides a snack / espresso shop that is available upon request. Groups are not allowed to bring snacks or sodas to **sell** to campers unless under special arrangement with Lost Creek Village. This service allows us to keep costs down for you. Snacks that are for free within the group are allowed.



- Lost Creek Village is located at the end of a power grid route and telephone line route. Please be aware that power is **limited** and we sometimes have power outages for reasons outside of our control. Your group is responsible

for any electrical equipment that you choose to bring as we cannot be responsible for equipment damage that is caused by overloading the power available or by power outages.

- All services and requests should be made in advance in writing. We will happily comply with all reasonable requests. Due to changes both in leadership of a given group and Lost Creek Village's personnel from year to year, no provisions or requests should be assumed.
- No defacing of camp property. Any damage must be reported to the caretakers. Your camp is liable for the cost of replacement.
- Summer groups: all summer groups planning to use the swimming pool or river for swimming must provide a certified lifeguard. The lifeguard must provide a current certification card to the Lost Creek Camp Director prior to use of the swimming pool.
- Lost and found items will be saved for one month and then donated to the Mission.

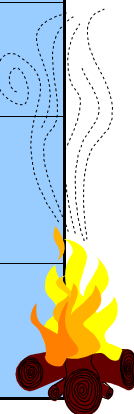

PHONE, INTERNET, CELL SERVICE

There is a payphone located outside of the lodge. The payphone number is: 509-658-2390. This is the number that you should inform your campers to have any incoming calls made to. The payphone will ring inside the lodge so that you can hear it ringing for your group.

At this time: There is basic wireless available outside the camp office for \$5 per day. (Please be aware that this is somewhat basic and reception is not always reliable.)

Outgoing calls are expected to be made on the payphone. There is no cell service.

The payphone accepts quarters, collect, or calling card.

(The payphone will use up quite a bit of your calling card).

SELF-COOKING AND FOOD SERVICE POLICIES

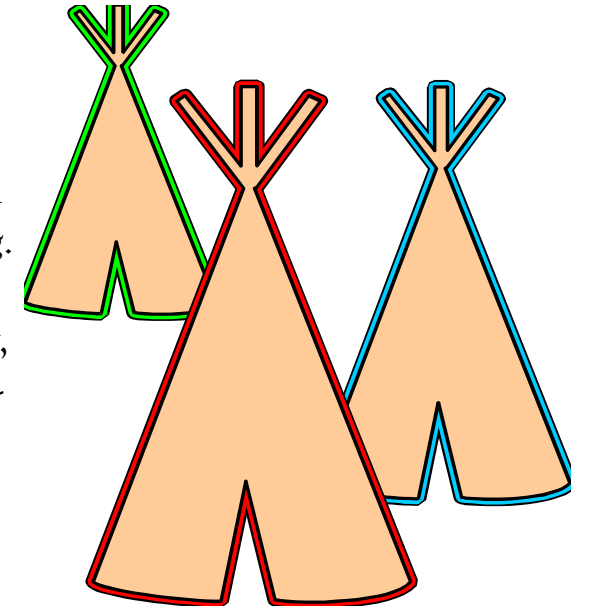
- If your group is planning on cooking for yourselves, at least one of your kitchen crew **MUST** have a current food-handlers permit with them. Please follow the safety standards of the food-handler training and practice kitchen cleanliness throughout your stay to avoid food illness in your group.
- Kitchen Use fee: a flat fee of \$45 per day (\$15 per meal) is added to the final bill if you opt for the self-cooking option.

Due to septic system care and maintenance, please scrape off all dishes into the garbage before putting them through the dishwasher. The dishwasher is mainly a sanitizer and will not remove left-on food. Do not leave any dirty dishes when you leave.



HOUSING, RATES, AND PARKING

- Below are available housing and room capacities with rates per night.
- The Health Department requires an adult to youth ratio of 1:7. Be sure to have an adult in each cabin room where youth will be sleeping.
- Please bring your own linen / sleeping bags, pillow, and bath towels. (Don't forget to inform your guest speakers.)
- **CLEANING FEE:** the following cleaning fees are added to the final bill if your group does not choose the cleaning option before you leave. You may opt to clean all or part of the camp to reduce or eliminate this fee from your bill. Cleaning entails: vacuuming lodge and couple's cabins, sweeping lodge and other cabins, take out garbage, and if cooking for yourselves- cleaning the kitchen. Fee: \$100 for lodge, \$5 per couple's cabin and teepees, \$10 per cabin bunkrooms.
- Please park in designated parking areas. The courtyard is provided for loading and unloading only and needs to be clear for fire truck access in case of fire or emergency in any Hillside cabin or the main lodge.



FIRST AID, EMERGENCY, AND DISASTER INFORMATION

- Each group is responsible for the health and treatment of its members. It is **STRONGLY** recommended that you bring a nurse or EMT as these are not provided by Lost Creek Village.
- It is highly recommended that you have medical information for all campers under the age of 18 and authorization for emergency medical treatment signed by a parent or guardian.
- A standard first aid kit and an infirmary are available for your use. Ingestible items are not provided.
- Please notify the camp directors of any serious illness or injury.
- In the event of a lost camper, forest fire, or other natural disaster event:
 1. Remove all campers from the scene of danger.
 2. Bring youth into a group and make sure they are supervised by adults during any crisis to avoid confusion or panic.
 3. Notify the camp directors immediately and we will assist in any appropriate calls for assistance or emergency calls.

FOOD SERVICE

- If you have reserved our camp cooking service, we require a final head count one week prior to your arrival. This is the minimum count that you will be billed for. There is also a one week prior reservation required in order to take advantage of this service if you have not already reserved.



- Standard camp cooking service mealtimes are assumed to be: Breakfast at 8:00 a.m., Lunch at noon, and Dinner at 5:00 p.m.

If you would like a different time for any of these meals please be sure to let us know.

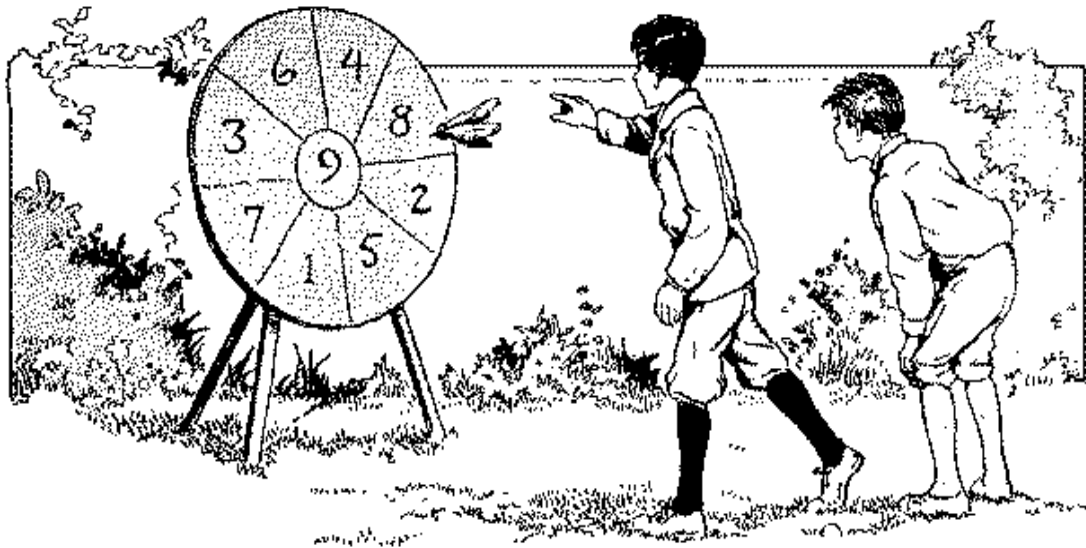

YOUTH GROUP POLICIES

- The Health Department requires an adult to youth ratio of 1:7. Please be sure to have adults involved in supervision of activities, the lodge, and cabin rooms.
- A responsible adult must sleep in each cabin room and lodge bunkroom where youth are sleeping.
- Be sure to tell your group to respect the Camp Caretaker's house and belongings as off-limits.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

No permit required to park at bottom of trail but a reservation is recommended to use the lodge. Lost Creek Camp office can direct you to trail entrance. Suitable for sledding, skiing, and snowmobiles.

- **Snow park permits** are sold at Whistlin' Jacks 4 miles up HWY 410 from Lost Creek Village. Check with camp office.
- **Snowmobile rentals are available along HWY 410 about 5 miles** before Lost Creek Village: 509-658-1032.
- **White Pass Ski Lodge** is located on HWY 12 approximately 45 minutes from Lost Creek Village. White Pass Ski Lodge is a full-service ski facility with ski rentals, ski runs, tubing hill, cross-country ski trails, and day lodge.
- **Suntides Golf Course** is located on HWY 12 just outside of Yakima.
- **Whistlin' Jacks** is the nearest gas station with a convenience store, lodging, and fine restaurant. Buffet specials are usually on Thursday evenings and live music is often provided. Gourmet desserts are a specialty.
- **Gold Creek Station** at the end of Old River Road provides a restaurant with a specialty of dinner-plate sized pancakes and fish and chips, a convenience store, laundry and shower facilities, and snowmobile rentals.
- **The Woodshed:** Restaurant specializing in down-home comfort cooking. Also has a gas station and market store. Located 20 minutes east of us on HWY 410. A favorite of locals going home from work.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

OFF-SITE

- **Boulder Caves**: located 4 miles up Old River Rd. A 1-mile gradual uphill trail with a waterfall and caves. Makes a very pleasant excursion in the hot summer months. There is parking, an outhouse, and picnic area at the base. A parking fee is charged. Closed in the winter for bat hibernation. A flashlight is recommended.
- **Bumping Lake**: approximately 45 minutes up HWY 410 is a beautiful large lake with picnic areas, easy water / shore access, a boat launch and parking area with outhouses. A fee is charged for boat launching only.
- **Area waterfalls** are posted on our bulletin board in the main lodge as well as a wall map and area attractions.
- **Winter sledding and snowmobile** options range from reserved favorite of American Ridge Bowl to snow park areas.
 1. Little Naches- 10 minutes up HWY 410. Forest Service turn-out 1904 snow- park with outhouse (snow park permit required). This is a quarry bowl with great sledding potential for seasons with a lot of snow. Also a great starting point to snowmobile.
 2. Indian Flats- 15 minutes up HWY 410. Parking off side of HWY 410- bowl with flat field and trail. No outhouse and no permit required. Suitable for mild sledding and cross-country skiing.
 3. American Ridge Bowl is located 14 minutes up HWY 410 (mile marker 87) with a ½ mile hike. It is the pre-White Pass ski run with lodge open to sledding. website: www.fs.fed.us/r6/recreation/rentals/ow-american-ridge-lodge.

Currently, we do not provide any sledding on-site

INSURANCE AND LIABILITY POLICIES

All groups are responsible for insurance during their stay at Lost Creek Village. This includes any fees and charges due to the medical emergencies of those attending your camp such as: ambulance, Medi-vac and Life Flight charges, etc.

Sponsored Groups

A current year's "**Certificate of Insurance Coverage**" with Lost Creek Village camp as "**Additional Insured**" is required for all sponsored groups and must be sent by mail, e-mail or fax to the Camp Office within one month of the scheduled camp. Failure to provide this form will result in the cancellation of the event.

Private Groups

Private groups are responsible to carry proof of their own private medical coverage and the legal guardian of each family and all adults over 18 years of age must sign the Camp's "**Personal Release of Liability**" at check-in prior to using the camp facilities.

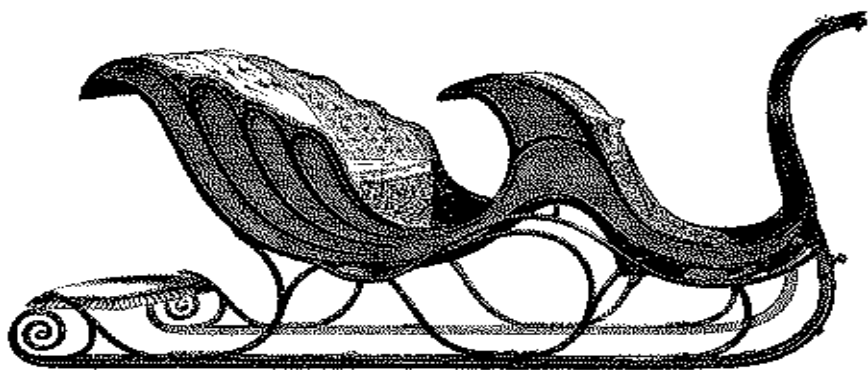


Please be sure that all activities planned are covered by your insurance policy and all drivers are properly licensed. This includes: snowmobiling, horseback riding, ropes, paintball, archery, etc.

Lost Creek Village and the Yakima Union Gospel Mission assume no liability for any injury or illness to anyone, whether on the camp property, or on the way to or from the property. Any group or individual accepting the use of the facility hereby waives the right to any and all claims for injury/illness which may arise from the use of this facility.

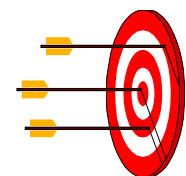
ROAD CLOSURE AND INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICIES

- During inclement weather, the group is responsible for the guaranteed minimum unless road closures prevent a group from coming or staying at Lost Creek Village.
- If road closures affect your ability to return home, a fair and reasonable fee will be negotiated to cover additional costs to Lost Creek Village and meet the needs of your group.
- During winter months, please be sure vehicle tires are appropriate for mountain conditions. It is recommended to include chains in your vehicle equipment.
- Chinook Pass summit and S.R. 213 are closed during the winter and usually re-open in May. Check with D.O.T for closures.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

- **Archery:** An archery range is located at the end of camp. Archery is available to groups as an extra programming option. Minimum of 5 participants and maximum of 20 participants per session. Minimum age of 10 years old. We provide all equipment and teaching for your group. Archery is wonderful for all physical abilities and a wide range of ages. Concentration, steadiness, and responsibility taught are applicable for many areas of life and bring a positive experience to each individual, along with a sense of accomplishment. Reservation required. \$10 per person per session. Groups are responsible to carry insurance covering this activity. Non-winter only.
- **Basketball Court / Pickleball:** A basketball court with hoops on all four sides. Also converts to a pickleball court with net and lines for single or double play. Equipment for basketball and pickleball is located at the snack shack. Camp staff can tell you how to play pickleball if you've never played - also referred to as "giant ping-pong" and "mini-tennis".
- **Edgar Rock trail / Lost Creek Trail:** A three and a half mile round-trip hike up to the beautiful vista of Edgar Rock is located in our driveway. This is a historic site used by Indians, military, and the Forest Service in the past but is left to nature now.
- **Snack Shack / Espresso stand:** Lost Creek Café is staffed and available in the afternoon free-time upon request and is a highlight for youth. The menu ranges from .05 cent candy up to \$3.50 for floats, mochas, and mini-sundaes.
- **The Naches River** flows directly beside Lost Creek Village and provides fishing most of the year. Fishing regulations do apply- please bring permit and fishing gear.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

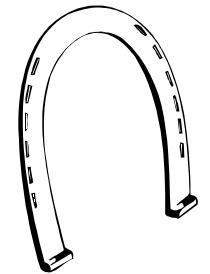
- **Paintball:** Lost Creek Village does provide and referee the two-acre woods-ball paintball course. Current price is \$25 per person for one session or \$20 per person per session if you bring your own gun. Cost includes: face mask, gun, CO2, fatigues, ref, and 500 paintballs. A parent permission slip is required (form enclosed) and there is a 10 year and older age restriction. Reservation is one week in advance for a minimum of 10 and maximum of 20 people per session. Plan several hours when programming this event in your schedule. Outside paintballs are not permitted but you may use your own gun if it shoots at 300 ft./sec. or slower. We do have a chronometer to check your gun if you are unsure of your gun's shooting velocity. Available in non-winter months only.
- **Recreation Field:** A 200' x 300' grassed recreation field is available for your use. There is a baseball backstop on one corner. Field equipment is available at the snack shack. The field is watered at night- please notify the camp office for special night game arrangements.
- **Sand Volleyball:** There is one sand volleyball court with net. There are two volleyballs available at the snack shack. The volleyball court is located beside the recreation field.
- **Folf Course:** Lost Creek has a nine wicket course that circles the campus through the trees. Maps and score sheets are available in the lodge. Frisbees are available at the snack shack.
- **Horseshoes:** Two full-size horseshoe pits with horseshoes are available for your use and are located next to the teepee village.



AVAILABLE EQUIPMENT

The main lodge meeting room is equipped with the following equipment for your use:

- Ping-pong table with paddles and balls (balls may be purchased from the dispenser at .25 cents)
- Foosball table with ball.
- Pool table with pool sticks and balls
- Large projection screen
- TV on a cart with a DVD player and a VCR
- Two microphone jacks with microphone
- Two speakers and overhead PA
- Podium
- 26 white eight-foot tables that fold and store on a cart
- 5 fold-up cafeteria tables with eight stool seats attached to each table
- 160 chairs: a mixture of padded stack chairs and molded chairs
- Payphone
- Fireplace with wood
- The kitchen is fully stocked with cooking and eating utensils, pots, microwave, two commercial propane ovens, grill, commercial convection oven, sanitizer, upright freezer, walk-in cooler, commercial ice-machine, washer and dryer.
- Black and white copies at \$0.10 per page.
- Basic wireless is available for \$5 per day. Reception is limited and not always reliable. If ours is unavailable, Gold Creek Station has wireless during hours of operation. Our bandwidth is not high enough to stream video.
- The infirmary is stocked with basic first aid equipment, one bed, sink, and closet toilet.



AVAILABLE EQUIPMENT

- Field equipment: baseballs, baseball gloves, baseball bats, baseball helmets, baseball bases, footballs, basketballs, volleyballs, soccer balls, frisbees for the folcourse, and pickleball racquets and balls are available. The score cards and fol course maps are posted in the main lodge.
- Horseshoes can be obtained from the office.

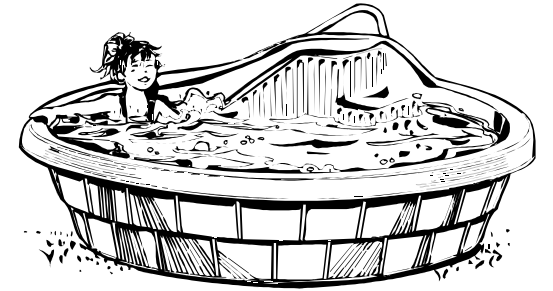
Please do not spray paint on the recreation field or the basketball court.



PROGRAM OPTIONS

ON SITE:

The swimming pool is available during stipulated hours from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. You must provide a current certified lifeguard during all pool times. The pool is heated throughout the summer.



A fire circle is available and is subject to the Forest Service fire bans. If you are using the fire circle, please have someone in your group attending the fire at all times and you must spray the embers down with water from the garden hose located beside the fire circle when you are done using the fire circle. During fire bans, you may bring a portable patio propane fire bowl with portable propane tank to be used in the fire pit. Please check with the camp office for fire bans.

High Ropes Challenge Course: The high ropes challenge course is available upon reservation. The ropes course has five elements- Burma Bridge, Catwalk, Giant's Ladder, Leap of Faith, and Staple Climb. This is a team building option that uses the group to assist and encourage its members to completion. Using this option has been very successful in creating group camaraderie for groups new and familiar with each other. Our trained staff will guide and oversee this option. A parent permission slip is required (form enclosed) and there is a 10 year and older age restriction. Current price is \$20 per person for one session. Reservation is one week in advance for a minimum of 10 and maximum of 20 people per session. Plan several hours when programming this event in your schedule. Available in summer only.
